DSC Constitution

Constitution of the Deaf Society of Canterbury Incorporated

1. NAME AND FOUNDATION YEAR

The name of the Society shall be the Deaf Society of Canterbury Incorporated, hereafter in this Constitution referred to simply as 'DSC'. The group was founded by John Kinnear in Christchurch as the 'Christchurch Deaf Club' in 1922 and incorporated in July 1952.

2. REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office of DSC will be as the Board of Management (hereafter in this Constitution referred to simply as "BoM") shall decide, and will be, where possible, co-located with any other DSC facilities.

3. OBJECTIVES AND VISION

- 3.1. To provide clubroom facilities and a community centre where all modes of communication are welcomed and embraced.
- 3.2. To promote and strengthen NZSL as a language of its own, with the culture and well-being of Deaf people paramount.
- 3.3. To focus on the social, recreational, educational needs and sporting activities of all members.
- 3.4. To encourage other charitable activities for our member groups, and families, with events, fundraising support and the sharing of technology and other resources.

4. MANAGEMENT

- 4.1.DSC shall have a BoM, comprising the following positions:
 a. President
 b. Vice President
 c. If required by law, a Statutory Officer will be appointed by the
 BoM, this position may be held by an existing member of the
 BoM and
 d. a minimum S and maximum of 7 additional BoM members.

4.2. The BoM may co-opt any person to the BoM for a limited, specified period, or generally until the next AGM. Those co-opted do not need to have been members immediately prior to their co-option.

APPROVED by members at the General Meeting 28 June 2020 Page 1 A copy of our constitution can be viewed on our website or a paper copy picked up from the office.

The BoM will be doing a review of the constitution in 2021. When it has been approved by a lawyer we will hold an SGM to have it approved by members.

We will then make NZSL videos of the constitution.
